

STUDENT MANAGED The Student Managed Investment Fund (SMIF) is an innovative **INVESTMENT FUND** experiential learning program that is comprised of business students at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. SMIF invests real funds from the UNC Charlotte Foundation endowment. Weekly meetings consist of updates on all major world economies, evaluations of both current and potential holdings, and periodic sector analyses. Students are appointed to execute all administrative aspects of portfolio management, such as formulation of accounting and performance reports, maintenance of a web site, organization of resources, and correspondence with local business professionals. Students also play an integral role in interviewing, evaluating, and recommending future portfolio managers. Finally, fund portfolio managers organize an annual report to be presented to the trustees of the University Endowment Fund at their annual meeting.

UNC Charlotte's Belk College of Business students use an interactive trading room which incorporates state-of-the-art financial technology, including two dedicated Sun Microsystem servers that allow students to build realistic and complex models of financial portfolios.

Members of the Business Honors Program (BHP) participate in stimulating coursework, leadership activities, careerbuilding exercises, and community service endeavors designed to promote marketability after graduation.

BHP students typically enroll in two honors courses per year for the duration of their college career. Classes are kept small to facilitate faculty and student interaction. BHP members also have access to a specialized academic advisor who ensures correct progression of the degree. Upon successful completion of the program, students will receive Honors commendation at graduation.
